### **ACS CCC Update**

#### 3 Part Webinar Series on Tobacco Cessation and Cancer Survivors

On September 25, our first speaker, CDC Epidemiologist Shayne Gallaway, PhD, MPH, discussed how to find and interpret the data for our individual states using the BRFSS Web Enabled Analysis Tool (WEAT).

On Wednesday, October 30, at 1 pm ET, Jamie Ostroff, PhD from Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, will discuss how tobacco cessation in cancer survivors can be addressed both personally and corporately by coalitions.

On Wednesday, November 20, at 1 pm ET, Jamie Studts, PhD from the University of Kentucky College of Medicine, explores the enduring stigma that exists in cancer survivors with a smoking history.

The online State Coalitions & Roundtables Guide is a one-stop-shop for resources to inform your state's collaborative HPV efforts. This National HPV Vaccination Roundtable Guide was developed with input from frontline HPV coalition leaders, and new content is added regularly. The resource has been recommended by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services National Vaccine Program Office as a valuable tool for state coalition building and partner coordination efforts.

Download charts and graphs as pictures with the click of a button and drop into presentations and handouts for your CCC meetings. Trends, survival rates, data by congressional district, and how your state measures up nationally in rates of cancer by their "risk" type -- i.e., alcohol-related, tobaccorelated, obesity-related, etc. Cancer care and prevention professionals, planners, advocates, journalists, and policymakers are encouraged to access this new tool to view and report cancer statistics.
