**Report on Cancer in AYAs:** Cancers in adolescents and young adults (AYAs)—in ages 15 to 39—are the focus of a new report <u>published in CA: A Cancer Journal for Clinicians on September 17, 2020</u>. The researchers looked at rates and trends by sex and race/ethnicity, across 3 smaller age groups: Ages 15 to 19 (referred to as adolescents or teens), ages 20 to 29, and ages 30 to 39. # **Cultivating Coalition Health**

From the Nine Habits of Successful Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalitions:

Habit #1: Empowered Leadership

Effective coalition leaders empower their members to make decisions. Empowerment builds trust and encourages accountability among members. Member satisfaction is assessed, and their needs are addressed by the coalition's leadership.

Read the statements below and rate your coalition from 1 (needs improvement) to 5 (we got this!), and then follow the link for simple ideas on how to make shared decision making the status quo for your coalition:

- Our coalition leaders are actively involved in coalition efforts.
- Our coalition leaders regularly communicate our goals, outcomes, progress, and successes.

- Our coalition leaders establish processes that encourage decision making and action from other coalition members.
- Our coalition conducts surveys to ascertain the level of satisfaction of our members and asks them about their needs and hopes for the future of the coalition.
