New Study Shows Sugar-Sweetened Drinks Increase Risk of Cancer Mortality

In <u>a large study</u> led by researchers at the American Cancer Society (ACS), men and women who drank two or more servings of sugar-sweetened beverages (SSB) per day, compared to people who never drank, had a five percent increased risk of death from obesity-related cancer, including gastrointestinal, postmenopausal breast, endometrial and kidney cancer. These results appear to be related to the higher body mass index (BMI) of the participants who regularly drank SSBs. The study was published on September 15 in <u>Cancer</u>,

NAVIGATION

SURVEY: The <u>National Navigation Roundtable's Evidenced Based Promising Practices Task</u> <u>Group</u> needs your help in disseminating a survey to your coalition's patient navigation partners. The Commission on Cancer recently approved a new quality metric for head and neck cancer: time to initiation of postoperative radiation therapy. This NNRT survey -- which will take only 8-10 minutes to complete -- is gathering information on the current landscape of PN work with head and neck cancers, as well as barriers and facilitators to enhancing navigation through postoperative radiation therapy for patients with head and neck cancer. U.S. District Court Ruling Jeopardizes Access to Proven, Life-Saving Cancer Screenings

On September 7, U.S. District Court Judge Reed O'Connor issued a ruling that may lead Affordable Care Act-compliant health plans to deny coverage for or reinstate cost-sharing for certain preventive health services. The ruling declared the method of appointment of officers to the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force unconstitutional, meaning its recommendations may no longer be guaranteed under the Affordable Care Act. These recommended services

ensure affordability to millions and include proven cancer screenings for breast, colorectal, cervical, and lung cancer.
