ACS Research News

First Study of Trends in Cancer Death Rates by Congressional District

ACS has <u>published the first study of its kind</u> examining disparities in reducing cancer death rates by congressional district. Takeaways include:

- Districts in the Midwest and South, regions with generally weaker tobacco control policies, had the slowest decline in lung cancer deaths.
- The highest colorectal cancer death rates are found around the Mississippi River Valley in the South and in Appalachia.
- For both breast and prostate cancers, the congressional districts which had previously had the highest death rates saw the largest reduction in deaths.

Disparities in the declines highlight the need for improved access to prevention and early detection services, such as increased federal and state funding for the National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program, tobacco control programs, Medicaid expansion, and passing the federal Prostate Specific Antigen Screening for High-Risk Insured Men Act.

Cancer Advocates Urge Congress: Refrain from Tying Debt Limit Proposal to Problematic Public Health Provisions

Cancer advocates are urging legislators to reconsider some aspects of the Live, Learn, Grow Act that proposes significant cuts to federally funded cancer research. The proposed deal would reduce federal spending for agencies such as the National Institutes for Health and National Cancer Institute in exchange for raising the nation's debt ceiling. The Act would also implement Medicaid work requirements that would restrict access to affordable health care. Find out more here.
